- 1. Critically analyse whether the provisions of the Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act, 1971 are adequate enough to protect the reproductive autonomy of women in India.
- 2. Indian judgments on medical negligence have carved out an exception to section 304A IPC in the case of medical professionals. Do you agree to this statement? Give reasons.
- 3. Indian Supreme Court has not been consistent in the application of Bolam's test or Bolitho's principle. Discuss.
- 4. Medical law is often concerned with a conflict between 'doing what is in the best interests of the patient' and 'doing what the patient says what he or she wants to do'. Discuss.
- 5. The opt-in consent provision under section 3(2) of the Transplantation of Human Organs and Tissues Act essentially overrides the power of the donor to consent to transplantation. Discuss.
- 6. Critically analyse the provisions of the Surrogacy (Regulation) Act, 2021.
- 7. Discuss the provisions of National Ethical Guidelines for Biomedical and Health Research Involving Human Participants, 2017.
- 8. Discuss whether compulsory vaccination scheme is against the right to privacy and religion.
