- 9. As part of an effort to clean up the city, the municipal corporation evicted the pavement dwellers in a week without any notice. The representatives of the pavement dwellers filed a writ in the High Court against the action of the municipal corporation. The stand of the corporation was that the eviction process was in compliance with the statutory provision to evict illegal constructions without further notice. Decide.
- 10. As per government policy, a government company sold its shares and reduced the number of employees in the company. The employees' union of the company filed a petition before the Supreme Court against the disinvestment and the decision to reduce the number of employees in the company. Decide the scope of judicial review.
- 11. Oceanic Sea Foods (OSF) was a company engaged in the procurement, processing and export of sea foods. The Chairman, Marine Products Export Development Authority, issued a notice to OSF to show-cause why their Certificate of Registration should not be cancelled. The company replied to the notice denying all the allegations. The authority, without giving any reasons and personal hearing, cancelled

the Certificate of Registration. Advise OSF on the grounds on which the order of cancellation could be challenged through a writ petition.
