- III. How are medical devices regulated in India? Clarify the significance of such devices in the healthcare sector.
- IV. Why is compliance with research ethics of paramount significance in the designing and conducing of biomedical research?
- V. What do you understand by therapeutic cloning? How is it different from reproductive cloning? How does the Indian legal framework regulate therapeutic cloning?
- VI. "Recently, the field of genetics has given rise to a technology that many claim will revolutionize the biological sciences and propel the field into a transformative phase: the powerful gene-editing tool known as CRISPR-Cas9". Critically comment on the legal implications of this technology.
- VII. With special reference to the relevant major international instruments, bring out the fundamental principles to be observed while conducting research involving human participants.
- VIII. What are the ethical and legal challenges raised by assisted reproductive technologies? In your opinion, are they adequately addressed in India?
