1. Discuss the scope and nature of injunctions as remedies in torts? When are permanent and interim injunctions granted?
2. Has the definition of a consumer changed over the years? Cite caselaw where necessary.
3. Do you think that courts have expanded the scope of liability of doctors and lawyers under the Consumer Protection Act?
4. Do you feel that the inclusion of product liability has made the Indian consumer law on par with foreign jurisdictions?
5. A, who is 17 years old, drives his 20-year-old friend B's motor car at 90 kmph on a busy city street, under the influence of cocaine and meets with an accident killing two pedestrians. The legal heirs of the pedestrians initiate a claim against B for compensation. B maintains that she was not aware of the age of A and claims that at the time when the vehicle was handed over to A, he was not under the influence of cocaine and that A might have had cocaine after the delivery of the car by B. Decide.
6. Discuss the role of the Central Consumer Protection Authority under the Consumer Protection Act.
7. Elaborate on the rules relating to registration of motor vehicles under the Motor Vehicles Act.
8. Write **SHORT NOTES** on **ANY TWO** of the following. (5 marks **EACH**)
 - (a) Necessity for insurance of motor vehicles.
 - (b) No-fault liability under the Motor Vehicles Act.
 - (c) Extra-judicial remedies in tort law.
