1. Distinguish between offer and invitation to treat with the help of examples.
2. What is meant by anticipatory breach? Examine the effect on the contract and the rights and obligations of parties arising out of such breach.
3. Examine the rule relating to measurement of damages in the light of Hadley v. Baxendale.
4. Vijay offered his car for sale and the quoted amount was Rs. 5 lac. Thomas came to know about this, wrote a letter to Vijay, and handed it over to his son to send it to Vijay. But the letter did not reach Vijay. Vijay sold his car to Mathew. Thomas would like to challenge the sale on ground of his 'acceptance' to the offer. Analyse.
5. The contract between A and B stated that Mr. A need to provide a monthly allowance to Mr. B and, after his lifetime, to B's widow. After the death of B, A fails to continue the performance. B's widow files a suit to enforce the contract. Is she entitled to file, by the application of the 'privity of contract' principle?
6. A minor borrowed a sum of money by executing a bond. On attaining the age of majority, another bond is executed based on the first one, along with the interest accrued. The creditor wants to enforce the contract on the ground that the minor, on attaining majority, has entered into the second bond. Decide
7. Elaborate on who are entitled to obtain the relief of specific performance.
8. What is meant by substituted performance? Elaborate on the significance of the same in the light of the Specific Relief Act.
