1. Critically examine whether 'guilt by association' theory is made applicable in India in the context of membership of a terrorist organization.
2. Comment on Asif Iqbal Tanha v. State of NCT of Delhi (June 2021).
3. Examine how the Indian Judiciary managed to grant bail in Union of India v. K.A. Najeeb (2021) irrespective of the stringent provisions in UAPA.
4. "Section 20 of UAPA cannot be interpreted to mean that merely being a member of a terrorist gang would entail such a member for the punishment. What is important is the terrorist act and what is required for the Court to see is the material before the Court to show that such a person has been involved in or has indulged in a terrorist act." Comment.
5. Explain the steps taken at the international level to combat terrorism.
6. Compare the counter terrorism law/s in India with that of the law/s in U.S.
7. Examine the laws in India relating to organised crimes.
8. Discuss the legal position in India with regard to sanction for prosecution in UAPA matters.
