X. X was the boss of Y, both working in the branch of a multinational company in India. The company had an email server which permitted for recalling messages within 30 minutes, even if read by the addressee. X sent an email to Y with respect to the closure of a contract that the company was having with another company. Y, within 20 minutes of receipt of the email, acted in furtherance of the same and closed the contract. However X recalled the email within 25 minutes of sending it. The closure of the contract was questioned by X stating that Y was not authorised to do so. There was an internal dispute between X and Y. Both of them relied on provisions of the Information Technology Act, 2000 for support of their version. Who can be considered as correct in his position.
